School Supplies Program Starts Early This Year

St. Columba Ministries has been providing school supplies to needy children in our community for as long as anyone can remember. We start this process in the late Spring when we begin collecting school supplies from our church, business and individual supporters. In all previous years, we have distributed supplies the first week of school and this made sense at the time: students got their list of supplies on the first day of school and parents frantically ran to the store(s) to pick up 6 different colored folders, 8 No. 2 pencils, wide (not college) ruled paper, and whatever else was needed for students to get a successful start to the school year.

Well, times have changed. Not only are students often expected to have their supplies on the first day of school, but some even receive their list of supplies at the end of the previous school year. Or they can simply go online (e.g., search by zip code at www.school-supply-list.com) and see what items are needed for their particular school and grade level.

In talking with parents over the past couple years, we learned that it is difficult for those who are facing financial challenges to get the supplies in time for the start of the school year. This makes the first day of school even harder for children if they don't have their supplies. If we start our program a week earlier, maybe we would be more available to help more disadvantaged children prepare for their school year. So, we talked with the kind folks at Lafayette Presbyterian Church and some of our volunteers and everyone agrees it's a good idea to have this year's School Supplies Program the week of August 30 – September 3.

We are still going to collect school supplies as soon as you want to bring them to us, but we ask that you get them to us **before August 26** so we have time to transport them to the church and get set up for the following week. We will also need volunteers that week, from 9 to 3. Please contact Alicia at 627-6748 if you wish to volunteer.

The items we need this year include: college and wide ruled notebook paper and spiral notebooks, pens (blue, black and red), colored pencils, markers, scissors, compasses, protractors, calculators, erasers, 3-ring binders, folders with prongs, highlighters, graph paper, glue, composition notebooks, dictionaries, crayons, rulers, pencils, index cards, pencil boxes, tissues, hand sanitizer, and backpacks. Homelessness in Hampton Roads

The Regional Taskforce to End Homelessness recently worked with the Center for Urban and Community Services (CUCS) to conduct a Regional Needs Assessment for Norfolk and the surrounding area. CUCS worked closely with organizations that assist homeless and low-income residents in Hampton Roads to get a picture of the need presented by the population we serve, the services we have available and how we can move forward to end homelessness. Highlights from this study are presented below.

All data was collected from the 2008 Housing Inventory for the city, except Western Tidewater, which was the 2007 Housing Inventory.

Numbers do not include seasonal overflow beds, such as N.E.S.T. or Winter Shelter.

Based on these and other findings, CUCS had the following recommendations:

- Increasing outreach strategies that focus on moving those persons living on the streets into housing
- Increasing day center access to case management, employment, and health services
- Providing a housing-focused service model in emergency shelters that continues into housing
- Creating permanent supportive housing units/vouchers for singles and families
- Ensuring that short-term financial assistance is available to prevent homelessness
- Continuing to expand and support the SSI/SSDI Outreach, Access, and Recovery program
- Developing resources to assist persons with housing vouchers and support services for those who are ready to graduate from permanent supportive housing
- Ensuring that emergency shelter is available to those who desire to access shelter

Implementation of these recommendations will take planning and coordination among the services providers in Norfolk and surrounding areas. It is known that we need more affordable housing in our community, as well as greater capacity of the programs that currently serve those who are homeless or in threat of becoming so. As the economy continues to cause difficulties for our clients, we see more people facing homelessness and coming to us for assistance. In order to make progress, and especially to avoid backsliding, as the economy also affects contributions to nonprofits, we continue to need the support of our community partners, including churches, businesses and individuals. Without you, the work St. Columba and other organizations that serve those in need would be possible and continued progress to end homelessness would also not be possible.
